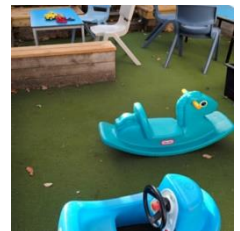
Parent Governor

EYFS

Book of the Week – Leaf Man by Lois Elhert

Literacy – writing labels and captions

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KS1

Maths: Year 1 & 2 – to practise known number bonds to 10 and 20, use these bonds to solve missing number sentences.
 English: Skills week focusing on Handwriting. Year 1 Grammar - sequencing sentences to make short narratives. Year 2 Grammar – investigating nouns, verbs and adjectives.
 Phonics: Year 1 – words that end in the ‘v’ phoneme spelt ‘ve’ such as ‘have’. Year 2 – Common Exception Words.
 Music: Starting to learn songs for the Nativity production.

KS2

We are continuing learning about Ancient Greece and starting our new topic in science by mixing/separating materials.

Year 3 and 4

In English we will be writing our own poems using the style of Bonfires by Enid Blyton. In maths we will be applying all our addition and subtraction skills learnt over the past few weeks to estimate and check.
 Computing this half term will be looking at branching keys and how to use databases to store information.
 In Music, Year 3 and 4 will be learning how to play the Glockenspiel.

Year 5 and 6

In English, we will be enjoying poems by T. S. Eliot and writing newspaper reports. In Maths we will be working on Decimal and Fraction equivalents as well as written division problems.
 In RE, Years 5 and 6 will continue to explore the question “Was Jesus the Messiah?” by looking at evidence from the Christmas story.
 Computing this half term is all about encryption and looking at different types of code including Morse, semaphore and Enigma.
